- ◆ Comfortable work boots
- ◆ water tight (ziplock) pouches
- ◆ Flood, rain boots
- ◆ Rain jacket and pants
- ◆ Bandannas Brush/comb/hair bands
- ◆ Hat/cap
- ◆ Work gloves
- ◆ Jacket
- ◆ Hand warmers
- ◆ Sweatshirt
- ◆ Sweat pants
- ◆ Jeans
- ◆ Comfortable shoes (off-duty)
- ◆ Sleepwear
- ◆ Underclothes
- ◆ Thermal underwear (if appropriate)
- ◆ Socks
- ◆ Swimsuit and flip-flops (for showers)
- ◆ Travel alarm clock
- ◆ Sleeping bag/pad
- ◆ Portable pillow
- ◆ Tent (1-2 person- ask responding agency if provided)

◆ **Hygiene, Protection, and Comfort Items**

- ◆ Anti-itch cream
- ◆ Aspirin
- ◆ Baby wipes
- ◆ Band aids
- ◆ Cotton balls
- ◆ Deodorant
- ◆ Diarrhea medicine
- ◆ Ear Plugs
- ◆ Eye drops
- ◆ Feminine hygiene products
- ◆ Hand lotion
- ◆ Insect Repellent
- ◆ Kleenex
- ◆ Lip balm
- ◆ Medications
- ◆ Muscle rub/ointment
- ◆ Q-tips
- ◆ Rubber bands or hair ties
- ◆ Shampoo and conditioner
- ◆ Soap and container
- ◆ Stridex pads or similar (face washing without water)
- ◆ Sun screen/sun block
- ◆ Talcum powder
- ◆ Tooth brush
- ◆ Tooth paste
- ◆ Tweezers
- ◆ Vitamins
- ◆ Wash cloth

◆ **Other gear**

- ◆ Water-resistant watch
- ◆ Head lamp
- ◆ Flashlight, wind up preferred or extra batteries
- ◆ Wind-up small, battery powered radio

- ◆ Canteen/refillable water bottles
- ◆ Leatherman/similar all purpose tool
- ◆ Hand sanitizer
- ◆ Toilet paper or kleenex
- ◆ Sunglasses (with case and neck rope)
- ◆ Fanny pack/backpack/utility belt
- ◆ Emergency whistle
- ◆ Note pad & pens
- ◆ Cash, credit card, keys; (secure on person or locked vehicle. Take only what you need)
- ◆ Health insurance card
- ◆ Camera (secure on person or locked vehicle)
- ◆ Cell phone (secure on person or locked vehicle)
- ◆ Limit jewelry, valuables and irreplaceable

Extra Note:

- ◆ Bring washable items.
- ◆ Don't bring what you can't afford to lose
- ◆ You have to tote what you bring.
