9-12:30 a.m. Part I Classroom instruction:

Through films and lecture, participants will learn the best practices for being an animal responder in a disaster, EAS including intake protocols, interviewing skills, working with partner organizations in co-located shelters. The course will cover the basics of local, regional, and national response systems (animal response as it fits into the Incident Command System), psychological aspects of working a disaster for you and the client, kinds of EAS shelters, communication in a disaster, shelter assessments, Assistance animals in a shelter; coping with resources/ volunteers and "stuff" (donations), animal handling in stressful conditions and more.

A light lunch and refreshments are being donated. Please note diet restrictions when registering.

1-3ish p.m. Part II Experiential Hands On Practice (Part 1 required)

The second half of the day will be a live set up and practice of a basic (mock) emergency animal shelter including assessing supplies needed, shelter set up, intake procedures, use of a scanner, basic medical issues/limitations and referral, security in the shelter, coping with varied populations of clients and animals, practice techniques with animals, liaison with animal control. (Please note, only non-reactive animals are used for the training)
